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## trticle 1 GENERAL PURPOSE

.. 01 The general purpose of this Agreement is to establish and maintain collective bargaining relations between he Employer and it's employees within the bargaining unit and to provide an orderly procedure for the disposition )f grievances.
.. 02 The parties agree that unless specifically referenced at the beginning of an Article's clause all language :ontained in the Collective Agreement will pertain to all full time and part time employees.

## trticle 2 UNION RECOGNITION

!. 01 The Employer recognizes the Union as the exclusive bargaining agent for all service employees and legistered Practical Nurses employed by the Employer at St. Joseph's Hospital, Parkwood Hospital and Mount Hopt こentre for Long Term Care London, Ontario pursuant to OLRB Board File No. 37098-99 and decision dated jeptember 26, 2000.
tll lay employees employed by the Employer (St. Joseph's Health Care, London) at Grosvenor, Mount Hope and 'arkwood sites at London Ontario; save and except Professional Medical staff, Registered Nurses, Graduate nursinc itaff, Undergraduate Nurses, Graduate Pharmacist, Undergraduate Pharmacist, Coordinator, Graduate Dieticians, ;tudent Dieticians, Persons engaged in research work, Social Workers, Social Work Assistants, Technical and 'rofessional Personnel, Chief Engineer, Assistant Chief Engineer, Supervisors, Foremen, persons above the rank of jupervisor or Foreman, Office and Clerical staff, Security Guards, and Technical Unit Personnel covered by a ;ubsisting Collective Agreement between SEIU, Local 220 and St. Joseph Health Care, London.
?. 02 The Employer undertakes that it will not enter into any other agreement with the employees, either ndividually or collectively, which will conflict with any of the provisions of this Agreement.
.. 03 It is agreed that the word "employee" or "employees" wherever used in this Agreement shall be deemed to efer only to an employee or employees in the bargaining unit as hereinbefore defined and where the masculine , ronoun is used in this Agreement it shall be deemed to include the feminine pronoun, and visa-versa, where the :ontext so requires.

1. 04 Data to be supplied to the Union: On a monthly basis; changes of supervision as they occur, list of members raying dues and the amount. On a semiannual basis; a lists of names, addresses, postal codes and telephone lumber if not otherwise unlisted or protected for reasons of privacy of members who are currently in the , argaining unit.

## IRTI CLE 3 NO DISCRIMI NATI ON

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3.01 The Employer and the Union agree that there shall be no discrimination, interference, restriction, intimidation :oercion exercised or practiced by either of them or their representatives or members against any employee secause of membership or non-membership in the Union.

The parties agree that in accordance with the provisions of the Ontario Human Rights Code there shall be no discrimination against any employee, by the Union or the Employer by reason of race, creed, colour, age, sex, narital status, nationality, ancestry, handicap, place of origin, political affiliation or sexual orientation.
3.02 Where the term "spouse" or "partner" is used in this Agreement, it shall also mean same-sex spouse or sartner, including but not limited to pension and benefits.

## tRTICLE 4 WORKPLACE HARASSMENT

I. 01 The Employer and the Union are committed to ensuring a work environment that is free from harassment. farassment is defined as a "course of vexatious comment or conduct that is known or ought reasonably be known o be unwelcome", that denies individual dignity and respect on the basis of the grounds such as gender, disability, ace, colour, sexual orientation or other prohibited grounds, as stated in the Ontario Human Rights Code. All smployees are expected to treat others with courtesy and consideration and to discourage harassment. ref. Jntario Human Rights Code, Sec. 10(1).
łarassment may take many forms including verbal, physical or visual. It may involve a threat, an implied threat or ee perceived as a condition of employment.
'roperly discharged supervisory responsibilities, including the delegation of work assignments and/or the issessment of discipline that does not undermine the dignity of the individual is in no way to be construed as iarassment.

Vords or actions that disparage or cause humiliation to a person in relation to one of the prohibited grounds can uccur in a variety of forms including remarks, gestures, graphics or jokes. Some examples of harassment are:

1) Remarks, innuendoes, or taunting about a person in relation to his or her racial or ethnic background, colour, slace of birth, religion, or any other prohibited grounds of discrimination;
)) Displaying material that is racist, derogatory or objectionable in relation to any of the prohibited grounds;
:) Refusing to converse or work cooperatively with an employee because of racial or ethnic background or any of he other prohibited grounds of discrimination;
2) Insulting gestures, graphics or jokes, based on a person's sexual orientation or any other prohibited grounds.
f an employee believes they have been harassed and/or discriminated against on the basis of any prohibited jround of discrimination, there are specific actions that may be undertaken. The employee should request the larasser to stop the unwanted behaviour by informing the harassing individual(s) that the behaviour is unwanted ind unwelcome. Should the employee not feel comfortable addressing the harasser directly, they may request the issistance of the manager or a Union representative. If the unwelcome behaviour was to continue, the employee vill consult the Employer Policy on harassment and will be free to pursue all avenues including the complaint nvestigation and resolution.
-he Parties agree that an employee may have a representative of the Union with them throughout the process, if equested.
-he Employer will advise the employee of their right to union representation.

## IRTICLE 5 REGI STERED PRACTICAL NURSE CERTIFICATION

i.01 A Registered Practical Nurse (RPN) is an individual who holds a General Certification of Registration with the
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こollege of Nurses of Ontario in accordance with the Regulated Health Professions Act and the Nursing Act. A RPN vill be required to show their current General Certification to their employer prior to February 15th of each :alendar year.
;.02 A Registered Practical Nurse (RPN) who is employed with the Employer and is without a current General こertification of Registration after February 15th of each calendar year shall be placed on non-disciplinary unpaid iuspension until the production/confirmation of a current General Certification of Registration. If a RPN presents evidence that their Certification of Registration has been reinstated, they shall be reinstated to their position effective upon presentation of such evidence. Failure to provide evidence within ninety (90) days of being placed in non-disciplinary suspension by the Employer will result in the RPN being deemed to be no longer qualified and he RPN shall be terminated. Such termination shall not be the subject of a grievance Arbitration.

## IRTICLE 6 NO STRIKE OR LOCKOUT

j. 01 There shall be no strikes or lockouts so long as this Agreement continues to operate. The word "strike" and he word "lockout" shall have the meaning as set forth in the Ontario Labour Relations Act.

## IRTICLE 7 MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

'. 01 The Union recognizes that the management of the hospital and the direction of the employees are exclusively vith the Employer and shall remain solely with the Employer except as specifically limited by the provisions of this tgreement and without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the Union acknowledges that it is the exclusive unction of the Employer to:

1) maintain order, discipline and efficiency;
)) hire, assign, discharge, promote, demote, classify, transfer, lay-off, recall, mandatory retire according to the :urrent legislation in the province and suspend or otherwise discipline employees for just cause;
:) determine in the interest of efficient operation and high standards, quality of service, job rating and :lassification, the hours of work, work assignments, methods of doing the work and the working establishments for he service;
2) generally to manage the operation that the Employer is engaged in and without restricting the generality of the oregoing, to determine the number of personnel required, methods, procedures and equipment in connection herewith;
?) make, enforce and alter from time to time rules and regulations to be observed by the employees, unless such ules or regulations are amended by this Agreement and then this Agreement shall take precedence.
'. 02 The Employer agrees that such rights shall be exercised in a manner consistent with the provisions of this tgreement.

## tRTI CLE 8 UNI ON SECURITY

3.01 The Employer shall deduct an amount equivalent to regular monthly Union dues for the term of this tgreement according to the following conditions:
a) all employees covered by this Agreement shall, as a condition of employment, have deducted from their pay sach month an amount equivalent to the regular monthly Union dues:
b) new employees shall have deductions made on the first regular deduction date following completion of thirty 30) calendar days of employment;
c) Union dues will be deducted from the employee's pay on the first pay in each calendar month and the same ;hall be remitted by the Employer to the Financial Secretary of the Union not later than the last day of the month
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ollowing the month in which the same were deducted by the Employer；
d）the Employer agrees when forwarding Union dues to submit a list indicating the names，classifications and ：hange of addresses of those employees for whom deductions were made，showing the amount deducted，as well is the names，addresses，classifications and dates of hire of those employees hired in the preceding month．

3．02 Regular monthly Union dues referred to in this article shall mean the regular monthly Union dues uniformly issessed all the members of the Union in accordance with its constitution and by－laws as certified to the Employer n writing by the Union．

3．03 The Union shall indemnify and save the Employer harmless with respect to all Union dues so deducted and emitted．

3．04 T－4 slips issued annually to employees shall show deductions made for Union dues．
3．05 The Employer agrees to pay into a special fund two thousand dollars（ $\$ 2,000.00$ ）each fiscal year of this Zollective Agreement commencing April 1， 2003 for the purpose of providing paid education leave．Such monies to ee paid into a trust fund established by the National Union，CAW effective April 30th of each fiscal year and sent to he following address：

－he Employer further agrees that members of the bargaining unit selected by the Union to attend such courses， nay be granted a leave of absence without pay provided the Employer can maintain its＇operations and provide idequate care upon granting such leave．
tn employee will be credited with seniority during such unpaid leave．

## tRTICLE 9 NEW EMPLOYEE ORIENTATION

1．01 The Employer agrees to acquaint new employees with the fact that a Collective Agreement is in effect and vith the conditions of employment set out in the Articles dealing with Union security．

1．02 The Employer agrees that the Union Chairperson or Committee person will be given an opportunity to meet vith new employees within regular working hours，without loss of pay，for up to thirty（30）minutes during the jeneral orientation，on the Employer premises，for the purpose of acquainting the new employee with the benefits ind duties of Union membership and the employee＇s responsibilities and obligations to the Employer and the Jnion．

## \RTICLE 10 UNION REPRESENTATI ON

．0．01 The number of Union Representatives the Employer shall recognize shall be site specific to St．Joseph＇s łospital，Mount Hope Centre for Long Term Care and Parkwood Hospital．It is understood that St．Joseph＇s Hospita vill include Withdrawal Management Service，HIV Clinic，Family Medical Centre and HMMS．The Employer will ecognize one（1）union representative for each one hundred members or portion thereof greater than fifty percent $50 \%$ ）plus one（1），but in any event no less than a total of twelve（12）union representatives，consisting of four 4）union representatives from St．Joseph＇s Hospital，five（5）union representatives from Parkwood Hospital，and hree（3）representatives from Mount Hope Centre for Long Term Care．The Employer will recognize from the above union representative one（1）chairperson for St．Joseph＇s Hospital，Mount Hope for Long Term Care， ＇arkwood Hospital and one（1）chairperson to represent the Registered Practical Nurses at St．Joseph＇s Health こare，London．
．0．02 The Employer shall grant the President of the Local Union and the National Representatives of the Union
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entry into each site of the facility upon proper notification of whom may be present with the Committee at any neeting with the Employer.
.0 .03
a) The Employer shall recognize the Union Representatives in outlined Article 10.01 above as the Negotiation こommittee.
b) The Employer shall recognize a Grievance Committee that consists of the site Chairperson, the Union lepresentative that assisted the grievor and the National Representative to handle all grievances other than Policy jrievances. The Grievance Committee to represent the Union on behalf of Policy Grievances will consist of the four 4) Chairpersons and the National Union Representative.
.0.04 The Union Committee and the Employer shall meet every second month at times mutually agreed upon. Jecessity for a meeting will be indicated by letter from either party to the other party, delivered five (5) days in idvance of the scheduled meeting, containing an agenda of the subjects to be discussed. Union representatives vill not suffer any loss of regular earnings for time spent at these meetings.
.0.05 The Employer agrees to provide each Chairperson voice mail, e-mail access and will assist the Chairperson o book rooms within the sites in order to meet with members. It is understood that Union Representatives have egular duties and responsibilities to perform and will not leave their regular duties and responsibilities to perform Jnion business without first notifying their Director/designate.
.0.06 The Employer agrees to retain the entire elected committee at work during any layoffs or cutbacks in mployment during their respective terms of office.
.0.07 The Union agrees to supply the Employer with the names of the Union Committee Representatives on a ;emi-annual basis.
. 0.08 Members of the Union committee will be maintained whole for time spent at Union/Management meetings and contract negotiations up to and including conciliation, for which permission has been granted. Maintained vhole may include discussions between the employee and their Director/designate, about adjusting hours of work or the employee, if care to patient/residents can be maintained. When the Employer requests a union committee رerson to attend an investigation or discipline during their time off, they will receive accumulated time off at their itraight time hourly rate for the time spent with the Employer.

## triticle 11 GRIEVANCE/ ARBI TRATI ON PROCEDURE

.1.01 For the purpose of this Agreement a grievance is defined as a difference between the parties relating to the nterpretation, application, administration or alleged violation of this Agreement.
.1.02 It is the mutual desire of the parties hereto that complaints of employees shall be adjusted as quickly as rossible and it is understood that an employee has no grievance until they have given the Employer the ıpportunity of adjusting the complaint. If an employee has a complaint, such a complaint shall be discussed with heir immediate supervisor within ten (10) calendar days after the circumstance giving rise to the complaint has rriginated or occurred. If the immediate supervisor is unable to adjust a complaint to the mutual satisfaction withir ieven (7) calendar days, the employee may proceed with the grievance procedure within seven (7) calendar days ollowing the decision of the immediate supervisor. Any employee is entitled upon request to have a Union jommittee member present with them when meeting with the supervisor to attempt to adjust their complaint.
.1.03 A grievance of an employee properly arising under this Agreement shall be adjusted and settled as follows:
;tep1
The employee with the assistance of a Union committee member if desired, must submit a written grievance ;igned and dated by the employee to their Director or designate. The nature of the grievance, the remedy sought

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ind a section or sections of this Agreement that are alleged to have been violated shall be set out in the grievance he Director or designate will deliver their decision in writing within seven (7) calendar days after the receipt of the رrievance. Failing settlement the next step of the grievance procedure may be taken.
itep2
Nithin seven (7) calendar days following the decision under Step1, the grievance must be submitted to Human lesources to be discussed at a meeting between representatives from the Employer, the Union committee and the prievor(s) within seven (7) calendar days of the receipt of the grievance. Either party may have assistance from utside the Employer at this stage if desired. The Employer shall give a written deposition within seven (7) :alendar days of the day of such meeting. Failing settlement, either party may submit the matter to arbitration vithin thirty (30) calendar days after the reply in Step 2 is given. If no request for arbitration is received within ;uch thirty (30) calendar day period, the grievance shall be deemed to have been abandoned.

## .1.04 Group Grievance

Nhere two or more employees have grievances of a similar nature and each employee would be entitled to grieve ;eparately, all such employees shall sign the grievance form and submit the grievance under Step 1 within ten 10) calendar days of the event giving rise to the grievances. The grievances shall be processed as one grievance iubject to all applicable provisions under the grievance procedure.

## .1.05 Policy Grievance

t grievance directly between the Employer and the Union concerning the interpretation, application or alleged , iolation of this Agreement must be originated under Step 2 within ten (10) calendar days of the event giving rise o the grievance. Failing settlement under Step 2, the grievance may be submitted to arbitration in accordance vith the provisions of this Agreement. However, it is expressly understood that the provisions of this paragraph nay not be used by the Union to institute a complaint or grievance directly affecting an employee which such ?mployee could themselves institute and the regular grievance procedure shall not be thereby bypassed, except mly where it is established by the Union that the interest of the bargaining unit as a whole is involved and may be iffected by the resolution of the issue resulting from the complaint.

## .1.06 Discharge Grievance

$\dagger$ grievance involving the discharge of an employee must be reduced to writing under Step 2 within seven (7) :alendar days of the employee being notified of their discharge. An employee may only be discharged for just :ause, except that an employee who has not completed his probationary period, may be terminated on the basis of i fair and proper assessment of their suitability for employment with the Employer, but which action may be taken ip as a grievance.
1.07 All agreements reached under the grievance procedure between the representatives of the Employer and the epresentatives of the Union will be binding upon the Employer and the Union and the employee(s) involved.
.1.08 The time limits set out in both the grievance and arbitration procedures herein are mandatory and failure to :omply strictly with such time limits except by the written agreement of the parties shall result in the grievance reing deemed to have been abandoned subject only to the provisions of the Ontario Labour Relations Act.
.1.08 Arbitration Procedure If the Employer or the Union requests that a grievance be submitted to arbitration, as lerein provided, it shall make such request in writing addressed to the other party to this Agreement.
-he Parties agree that a sole arbitrator shall resolve all grievances that have been processed to arbitration. The 'arties mutually agree to develop a roster of four (4) arbitrators. Grievances will be referred for hearing to one of he arbitrators on the roster, in rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if either Party wishes to utilize a Board of trbitration, they shall notify the other party of same and at the same time name a nominee.

Vithin seven (7) calendar days thereafter the other party shall name a nominee, provided however, that if such

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jarty fails to name a nominee as herein required, the Office of Arbitration of the Ministry of Labour of the Province If Ontario shall have power to effect such appointment upon application thereto by the party invoking the arbitration procedure.
.1.09 No person may be appointed as an arbitrator who has been involved in an attempt to negotiate or settle the jrievance.
.1.10 No matter may be submitted to arbitration that has not been carried through all requisite steps of the נrievance procedure.
.1.11 The Arbitrator/Board of Arbitration shall not have any power to amend, alter, modify or add to any of the נrovisions of this Agreement or to substitute any new provisions for any existing provisions, nor to give any lecision inconsistent with the terms and provisions of this Agreement.
.1.12 The proceedings of the Arbitrator/Arbitration Board will be expedited by the parties hereto and the decision If the majority and where there is no majority the decision of the Chairperson will be final and binding upon the parties hereto and the employee or employees concerned.
.1.13 Each of the parties hereto will bear the expense of the nominee appointed by it and the parties will share ?qually the fees and expenses, if any, of the Chairperson of the Arbitration Board.

## IRTI CLE 12 ACCESS TO FILE

.2.01 An employee shall upon written request, made a reasonable time before the time of viewing, have an , pportunity to view their personnel file in the presence of the Director of Human Resources or their designate. The nformation the employee may review will be:
a) application form;
b) formal disciplinary notations;
c) incident reports put into the file;
d) written evaluations;
e) letter of expectations.

## IRTICLE 13 ADMI NI STRATI ON OF DISCI PLINE

.3.01 Where an employee is subject to a suspension or discharge penalty, he or she shall be entitled upon his or ier request to have a Steward or Union Committee person present when the disciplinary action is taken. It is the :mployer's responsibility to inform the employee of his or her right to request such representation.
.3.02 Discipline is defined as a verbal or written warning, reprimand, suspension, dismissal or other disciplinary iction to an employee. No disciplinary action shall remain against an employee's record for a period longer than sighteen (18) months from the date of occurrence.
.3.03 It is agreed that the Union Chairperson or designate will be present at the discipline of any employee within he bargaining unit.

## trit cle 14 LOCAL OR NATI ONAL UNI ON LEAVE

.4.01 Any employee elected or appointed to a full-time position in the Local Union or National Union, CAW-Canada vill be granted a leave of absence by the Employer for a maxium of three (3) years. In addition, it is understood hat any employee so elected or appointed is required to maintain their competence in the event that they are to eturn to the workplace. It is understood that the intent of this Article is that it shall apply to only one employee at 1 time per circumstance as noted above, and that the Union shall provide adequate notice prior to an employee :ommencing Union Leave of Absence.

## IRTI CLE 15 SENI ORITY

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5.01 Probationary Period
a) Employees will be considered on probation until after the employee has completed either 337.5 hours or fortyive (45) days of work whichever comes first, within any twelve (12) calendar months.
b) An employee who has not completed her probationary period, may be terminated on the basis of a fair and roper assessment of their suitability for employment with the Employer, but which action may be taken up as a jrievance.
c) The Employer may request an extension of the probationary period for the purpose of training and orientation. t is understood and agreed that any extension to the probationary period will not exceed an additional thirty (30) lays of work or 225 hours. The Employer will advise the employee and the Union of the basis for such an sxtension. Any other extension for reasons not covered above may be granted with the agreement between the :mployer and the Union.
d) Full-Time Only

Jpon completion of such probationary period the employee's name will be placed on the full time seniority list with ieniority dating from the date the employee was last hired by the Employer.
e) Part-Time Only

Jpon completion of such probationary period the employee's name will be placed on the part time seniority list eing given credit for the probationary hours worked and will thereafter accumulate seniority on the basis of hours vorked in the Bargaining Unit.
.5.02 In cases of promotion, demotion, transfer, layoff and recall, seniority shall prevail, provided the senior !mployee possesses the bona fide qualifications and ability to perform the work available.
.5.03 Employer seniority lists of employees shall be prepared according to the records of the Employer as of anuary 1st and July 1st each year, and will be posted on the official Union bulletin boards, at each site, on or ,efore February 1st and August 1st respectively.
.5.04 The Employer will supply copies of the Seniority List, along with an updated list of all Supervisors, to the Jnion Committee and the Local Union Office, on or before February 1st and August 1st respectively.
.5.05 It is the employee's responsibility to ensure that his home address and telephone number are current at all imes. If the employee fails to do this, the Employer will not be responsible for failure to notify.
.5.06 Seniority shall continue to accrue for a period of twenty-four (24) months if an employee's absence is due to lisability resulting in WSIB benefits.
.5.07 Loss of Seniority and Employment Rights
In employee shall lose all service and seniority and shall be deemed to have terminated if the employee:
a) has been laid off for thirty (30) months;
b) resigns;
c) is absent from scheduled work for a period of three (3) or more consecutive working days without notifying the Employer of such absence and providing a reason satisfactory to the Employer and failure to notify was due to :ircumstances outside the employee's control;
d) fails to return to work on the expiration of leave of absence, except for reasons beyond the employee's control,
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or utilizes a leave of absence for a purpose other than that for which it was granted unless excused by the Employer in writing;
e) fails upon being notified of a recall to signify his or her intention to return within three (3) calendar days after le or she has received the notice of recall mailed by registered mail to the last known address according to the ecords of the Employer and fails to report to work within seven (7) calendar days after he or she has received the otice of recall or such further period of time as may be agreed upon by the parties.
f) fails to provide the Employer proof of registration or licence with the relevant professional association when equested on an annual basis.

## tRTI CLE 16 NOTI CE OF LAY-OFF

.6.01 In the event of a proposed layoff, the Employer shall:
a) provide the Union with no less than 6 months written notice of the proposed layoff or elimination of position; and
b) provide to the affected employee(s), if any, who will be laid off or whose job will be eliminated, with no less han four (4) months written notice of layoff, or pay in lieu thereof.

## IRTI CLE 17 LAYOFF AND RECALL

.7.01 In the event of a layoff, the Employer shall layoff employees in the reverse order of their seniority within heir classification, providing that there remain on the job employees who then have the bona fide qualifications ind ability to perform the work.
-7.02 An employee who is subject to layoff shall have the right to either:
a) accept the layoff, or
b) opt to receive a separation allowance as outlined in Article 19, or
c) opt to retire, if eligible under the terms of the Hospitals of Ontario Pension Plan (HOOPP), or
d) displace an employee who has lesser bargaining unit seniority and who is the least senior employee in a lower rr identical paying classification in the bargaining unit if the employee originally subject to layoff has the bona fide jualifications and ability to meet the normal requirements of the job in the lower or identical classification. Such ?mployee so displaced shall be laid off. Any person displaced through the bumping procedure shall himself or lerself be entitled to utilize the procedure.
7.03 Full-Time
a) In the event the bumping procedure is exhausted within the full time classifications, a laid off full-time mployee who does not have the seniority to bump within the full-time classifications shall be given the , pportunity to utilize the bumping procedure with respect to the least senior part-time position provided the laid )ff full-time employee has more seniority and has the bona fide qualifications and ability to meet the normal equirements of the job.
b) Where a full-time employee utilizes the above procedure to accept part-time employment, his or her right to ecall to full-time employment is maintained. Such full-time employees transferring into part-time positions(s) shal :arry their full seniority and service credits with them.

### 7.04 Part- Time

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a) In the event of a layoff of part-time employees the employee who is subject to layoff shall have the right to sither accept the layoff, or displace an employee who has lesser bargaining unit seniority and who is the least ienior in a lower or identical paying classification in the bargaining unit if the employee originally subject to layoff las the bona fide qualifications and ability to meet the normal requirements of the job in the lower or identical :lassification. Such employee so displaced shall be laid off. Any person displaced through the bumping procedure ;hall himself or herself be entitled to utilize the procedure.
b) In the event the bumping procedure is exhausted within the part-time classifications, a laid off part-time mployee who does not have the seniority to bump within the part-time classification shall be given the ,pportunity to utilize the bumping procedure with respect to the least senior full-time position provided the laid off sart-time employee has more seniority and has bona fide qualifications and ability to meet the normal equirements of the job.
c) Where a part-time employee(s) utilizes the above procedure to accept full-time employment, his or her rights o recall to part time employment under this article is maintained. Such part-time employees transferring into the ull-time position shall carry their full seniority and service credits with them.

JOTE: An identical paying classification where the straight time hourly wage rate at the level of service :orresponding to that of the laid off employees is within seven percent (7\%) of the laid off employees straight time ourly wage rate.
.7.05 An employee shall have opportunity of recall from a layoff to an available opening, in order of seniority, رrovided he or she has the bona fide qualifications and ability to perform the work before such opening is filled on i regular basis under the job posting procedure. The posting procedure in this Agreement shall not apply until the ecall process has been completed.
.7.06 In determining the ability of an employee to perform the work for the purposes of the paragraphs above, the Employer shall not act in an arbitrary or unfair manner.
.7.07 An employee recalled to work in a different classification from which he or she was laid off shall have the )rivilege of returning to the position he or she held prior to the layoff should it become vacant within six (6) nonths of being recalled.
7.08 No new employees shall be hired until all those laid off have been given an opportunity to return to work ind have failed to do so, in accordance with the loss of seniority provision, or have been found unable to perform he work available.
.7.09 It is the sole responsibility of the employees who have been laid off to notify the Employer of his or her ntention to return to work within five (5) calendar days (exclusive of Saturday, Sundays, and paid Holidays) after eeing notified to do so by registered mail, addressed to the last address on record with the Employer (which lotification shall be deemed to have been received on the second day following the date of mailing) and to return o work within ten (10) calendar days after being notified. The notification shall state the job to which the mployee is eligible to be recalled and the date and time at which the employee shall report for work. The mployee is solely responsible for his or her proper address being on record with the Employer.
7.10 Employees on layoff or notice of layoff shall be given preference for temporary vacancies, which are expected to exceed ten (10) calendar days. An employee who has been recalled to such temporary vacancy shall lot be required to accept such recall and may instead remain on layoff.
.7.11 No full-time employee within the bargaining unit shall be laid off by reason of his or her duties being issigned to one or more part-time employees.
.7.12 In the event that a layoff commenced on the day immediately following a paid holiday, an employees who therwise qualified for holiday pay shall not be disentitled thereto solely because of the day on which the layoff :ommenced.
7.13 A laid off employee shall retain the rights of recall for a period of thirty (30) months from the date of layoff.

## IRTICLE 18 BENEFITS ON LAY-OFF

.8.01 In the event of lay-off, a laid off full time employee will be provided equivalent benefit coverage on the samt رasis as is provided to active employees for semi-private, extended health and dental benefits as defined in the jollective Agreement not to exceed five (5) months following the month in which the layoff occurred.

## trit CLE 19 SEVERANCE \& EARLY RETI REMENT OPTI ONS

.9.01 Where an employee resigns within 30 days after receiving notice of layoff pursuant to the notice of lay-off رrovision in this collective agreement, that his or her position will be eliminated, he or she shall be entitled to a ieparation allowance of two (2) weeks' salary for each year of continuous service to a maximum of twenty- six (26) veeks' pay, and, on production of receipts from an approved educational program, within twelve (12) months of esignation, may be reimbursed for tuition fees up to a maximum of three thousand $(\$ 3,000)$ dollars.
9.02 Where an employee resigns later than 30 days after receiving notice pursuant to the notice of lay-off رrovision in this collective agreement, that his or her position will be eliminated, he or she shall be entitled to a ;eparation allowance of four (4) weeks' salary and on production of receipts from an approved educational jrogram, within twelve (12) months of resignation, may be reimbursed for tuition fees up to a maximum of one housand, two hundred, fifty $(\$ 1,250)$ dollars.

### 9.03 Early Retirement Options

'rior to issuing notice of layoff pursuant to the notice of layoff provision in this collective agreement, in any :lassification(s), the Employer will offer early-retirement allowance to a sufficient number of employees eligible for sarly retirement under HOOPP within the classification(s) in order of seniority, to the extent that the maximum lumber of employees within a classification who elect early retirement is equivalent to the number of employees vithin the classifications) who would otherwise receive notice of layoff under the notice of lay-off provision in this :ollective agreement.

In employee who elects an early retirement option shall receive, following the completion of the last day of work, i retirement allowance of two (2) week's pay for each year of service, to a maximum of thirty (30) weeks on the rasis of the employee's normal weekly earnings. In addition, full-time employees will receive a lump sum payment equal to $\$ 1,000.00$ for every year less than age 65 , to a maximum of $\$ 5,000.00$.

In employee who elects an early retirement option shall be provided equivalent coverage to all full time employees vho retire early and have not yet reached age 65 and who are in receipt of the Employer's pension plan benefits on the same basis as is provided to active employees for semi-private, extended health and dental benefits as lefined in the collective agreement. The Employer will contribute the same portion towards the billed premiums of hese benefits plans as is currently contributed by the Employer to the billed premiums of active employees. The mployee will arrange with and provide the Employer either preauthorized payments or other arrangement suitable o the Employer and employee.

Jote: The Employer may offer any employee a retirement option as provided above, in order to avoid potential ayoffs in the unit.

## ARTICLE 20 JOB SECURITY

!0.01 Employees not covered by the terms of this Agreement will not perform duties normally assigned to those smployees who are covered by this Agreement, except for the purposes of instruction, experimentation or in mergencies where regular employees are not available.
-he Employer shall not contract out any work usually performed by members of the bargaining unit, if as a result If such contracting out, a layoff of any employees other than casual part?time employees results from such ontracting out.
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Jotwithstanding the foregoing, the Employer may contract out work usually performed by members of the , argaining unit without such contracting-out constituting a breach of this provision if the Employer provides in its :ommercial arrangement contracting out the work that the contractor to whom the work is being contracted, and iny subsequent such contractor, agrees:

1) to employ the employees thus displaced from the Employer; and
2) in doing so to stand, with respect to that work, in the place of the Employer for the purposes of the Employer's :ollective agreement with the Union, and to execute into an agreement with the Union to that effect.
n order to ensure compliance with this provision, the Employer agrees that it will withdraw the work from any :ontractor who has failed to meet the aforesaid terms of the contracting-out arrangement.

In request by the Union the Employer will undertake to review contracted services, which fall within the work of he bargaining unit. The purpose of the review will be to determine the practicality of increasing the degree to vhich bargaining unit employees may be utilized to deliver such services in the future. The Employer further igrees that the results of their review will be submitted to the Labour Adjustment Committee for its consideration

## !0.02 Technological Change

-he Employer agrees to notify the Union, in advance as far as practicable, of its intention to introduce technologica :hanges which the Employer has decided to introduce which will significantly change the status of employees vithin the bargaining unit. The Employer agrees to discuss with the Union the effect of such technological changes in the employment status of employees and to consider practical ways and means of minimizing the adverse sffects, if any, upon present employees.
-echnological Change means the automation of equipment, or the mechanization or automation of operations, or he replacement of existing equipment or machinery with new equipment or machinery that results in the displacement of an employee from their regular job.

Where new or greater skills are required than are already possessed by affected employees under the present nethods of operation, such employees shall be given a period of training during which they may perfect or acquire he skills necessitated by the new method of operation. There shall be no reduction in wage or salary rates during he training period of any such employee. Training shall be given during the hours of work whenever possible.

## ARTICLE 21 J OB POSTING

!1.01 In order to ensure that employees are given the opportunity of applying for transfers or promotions, the :mployer agrees to post all job category vacancies covered by this Agreement on Bulletin Boards for a period of ieven (7) calendar days. The successful applicant will be selected in accordance with the seniority provision in this tgreement and all employees in this bargaining unit shall be considered for such vacancies.
;ubsequent permanent vacancies resulting from the transfer of an employee will require the posting procedure, inless otherwise agreed to between the parties.
!1.02 Employees are eligible to apply to any position provided they have been in their current position for at least ;ix (6) months. The Employer and the Union can by mutual agreement waive this six (6) month period. It is inderstood the Employer and the Union will not prohibit the movement of employees that result in the change of itatus for the employee or classification. Status is understood to refer to full-time or part-time understood to refer o full-time or part-time.
!1.03 (a) The posting shall stipulate the bona fide qualifications, classification, status, current hours of work and he department concerned. It is understood that the hours of work reflect the current scheduling arrangements and are subject to change as determined by the Employer. Duration of vacancy will also be stipulated should the 'acancy not be permanent. If the start date of the posted position is greater than forty-five calendar days from the ast date the posting is closed, the Employer will notify the Union chairperson of the reason(s) for delay.

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b) When a full time vacancy arises within a scheduling unit/department the Employer at their discretion may offer he remaining full time employees within the classification the opportunity to move to different scheduled line as :urrently available within the scheduling unit/department. If more than one employee wishes to change their icheduled line the selection of the employee will be based on seniority. Such discretion will not be used in a discriminatory fashion.

## !1.04 Transference of Seniority/Service

jeniority: Refers specifically to time spent within the bargaining unit while continuously employed with the :mployer and as such is subject to the provisions of this Agreement and will apply as referenced in this tgreement.
jervice: Refers to continuous employment with the Employer that is not interrupted by separation from the :mployer and as such is subject to the provisions of this Agreement and will apply as referenced in this tgreement.
a) For the purposes of transfer of seniority, an employee's seniority and service shall be retained in the event an ?mployee transfers from full time to part time, or part time to full time, the employee shall receive credit for full ieniority and service on the basis of 1650 hours worked for each year of full time seniority or service. Any time vorked in excess of the equivalent, shall be prorated at the time of transfer.
b) If at any time the seniority of a part time employee is to be compared with the seniority of a full time employe $\epsilon$ or any reason, a part time employee's seniority shall be converted to the equivalent full time seniority on the basis of 1650 hours worked as 1 year. Notwithstanding, at no time and for any reason can a part-time employee's ieniority pre-date their actual date of hire after the conversion to the full-time equivalent. Where a part time smployee is successful to a full time position he/she will revert to date of hire for seniority purposes.
c) Should an employee transferring in accordance with this Article be unable to fulfill the duties of the position in juestion, the employee may be transferred back to their substantive position within the first sixty (60) days of the lew employment. The Employer shall meet with the Union to discuss the impact to the employee(s) and the Union If a transfer of the employee back to their substantive position.
!1.05 The successful applicant to a job posting will be provided with orientation on the job and upon assessment my the Employer, will receive training for added skills as required. The successful candidate must demonstrate :ompetency of the added skill within the time frame outlined in the learning plan. Should the successful applicant je unable to demonstrate competency within the original learning plan the Employer and union will meet to discuss vhether any further support may make the employee successful.
!1.06 The Employer may temporarily fill any vacancy or new job while observing the procedure herein set forth.
!1.07 Copies of any and all job postings shall be forwarded to the Union office and Union Chairperson once a nonth.
!1.08 Within five (5) calendar days of the date of the appointment to a vacant position, the name of the successful ipplicant shall be posted on the Union Bulletin Boards.

## !1.09 Part-Time Filling of Temporary Full-Time Vacancies

a) Where a full time bargaining unit employee is absent from work for an extended period of time for any reason, ncluding pregnancy/parental leave and workers' compensation, or where bargaining unit work becomes available in a special non-recurring project basis for a period of time not to exceed eight (8) months a part time bargaining ınit employee or a series of part time bargaining unit employees will be entitled to work full time hours on a relief jasis to cover for the absence, or to cover the project. The Director of Human Resources or their designate will neet with the Union Chairperson or their designate as soon as such temporary vacancies arise to discuss filling iuch vacancies.

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b) Where both parties agree to fill the vacancy with a part time employee or a series of part-time employees, ;uch a process will be implemented, and the part time bargaining unit employee or employees who are scheduled o work the full time hours during the absence or employees who are scheduled to work the full time hours during he course of the project will continue to be covered under the terms and provisions of the Collective Agreement hat pertain to part time employees.
c) Where the position will not be filled with a part-time employee or a series of part-time employees, the Employer will fill the vacancy in accordance with the job posting procedure as outlined in article 21.01.
d) The Employer will notify the Union in writing where such temporary vacancy will be offered an extension of the emporary full time vacancy for a period not to exceed six (6) months.
!1.10 The Employer will outline in writing to the individual or individuals who will be working full time hours on a elief basis or on the project the expected duration of such employment as well as the classification concerned and ate of pay and the Union Committee Chairperson will also be given a copy of the letter. Upon completion of the emporary position, part time employees will return to the scheduling unit to which they were part, just prior to heir acceptance of the temporary position.

## IRTI CLE 22 ACCOMODATI ON

:2.01 When it has been medically determined that an employee is unable to return to the full duties of their oosition due to a disability, the Employer will notify and meet with representatives of the Union to discuss the :ircumstances surrounding the employee's return to suitable work. The Employer will notify the Union when the mployee has accepted suitable work. The Employer will commit to review positions within the bargaining unit for iuitable work prior to a review of all vacant positions within the Employer.
:2.02 The Employer recognizes its duty to accommodate the work or workplace to the needs of the disabled mployee in order to facilitate an early and safe return to work to the employee's pre-injury employment or other iuitable work.

־he Employer will notify the Union of employees who qualify to apply for WSIB and Long Term Disability (LTD).
-he employer agrees to provide the employee with a copy of the workplace and safety insurance board form 7, at he same time it is sent to the board.

## IRTICLE 23 LABOUR ADJ USTMENT COMMI TTEE

!3.01 (a) With respect to the development of any operating or re-structuring plan, which may affect the bargaininc init, the Union will be notified and shall be involved immediately in the planning process from the early phases hrough to the final phases of the process.
b) In addition to that, and to any other planning committee in the Employer of a more broadly representational nake-up, there shall be immediately established a Labour Adjustment Committee for the bargaining unit, which ihall meet during the term of this Agreement as mutually agreed by the parties.
t shall be the function of the Labour Adjustment Committee to consider possible ways and means of avoiding or ninimizing potential adverse effects upon employees in the bargaining unit, including:
i) identifying and proposing possible alternatives to any action that the Employer may propose taking;
ii) identifying and seeking ways to address the retraining needs of employees;
iii) identifying vacant positions within the Employer for which surplus members of the bargaining unit might jualify, or such positions which are currently filled but which are expected to become vacant within a twelve (12) nonth period.

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c) Composition and Meetings The Committee shall be comprised of equal numbers of representatives of the Employer and from the Union Committee. The number of representatives shall consist of at least two (2) epresentatives from each party to a maximum of five (5) representatives from each party.
$t$ is understood that employee time spent at meetings with the Employer in pursuance of the above, shall be leemed to be work time for which the employee shall be paid by the Employer at their regular or premium rate as nay be applicable.

Each party shall appoint a co-chair for the Committee. Co-chairs shall chair alternate meetings of the Committee ind will be jointly responsible for establishing the agenda of the Committee meetings, preparing minutes and vriting such correspondence as the Committee may direct.
d) Disclosure To allow the Labour Adjustment Committee to carry out its mandated role under this Article, the :mployer will provide the Committee with pertinent financial and staffing information and with a copy of any eorganization plans which impact on the bargaining unit.
e) Accountability The Committee shall submit its written recommendations to the Chief Executive Officer of the łospital and the Board of Trustees. Where there is no consensus within the Committee, the individual members of he Committee shall be entitled to submit their own recommendations.
!3.02 Any agreement between the Employer and the Union resulting from the above review concerning the nethod of implementation will take precedence over the other provisions of this Agreement.

## \RTI CLE 24 HEALTH, SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENT

!4.01 (a) The Employer and the Union agree, that they mutually desire to maintain standards of safety and health ind maintain every reasonable precaution in order to prevent accidents, injury and illness. The Employer shall :omply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1990, its regulations and codes of practice and environment, egislation and regulations in effect on the effective date of this Agreement, as minimum standards.
b) Where employees are working in high-risk areas for exposure to infectious or communicable diseases for which here are available preventative vaccinations, they shall be provided at no cost to the employees.
c) Where the Employer identifies high-risk areas where employees are exposed to infectious or communicable diseases for which there are available protective medications, such medications shall be provided at no cost to the mployees.
!4.02 (a) Joint Health and Safety Committee composed of two (2) CAW members per committee chosen by the Jnion. At no time shall the Employer representatives be allowed to outnumber the employee representatives.
b) Two co-chairpersons shall be elected by and from the members of the committee. One co-chair shall be an ?mployee member; the other shall be an Employer member.
c) The committee shall determine that inspections have been carried out at least once a month by the co-chairs ol lesignates.
d) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the committee shall:

1) Carry out monthly inspections of the workplace.
2) Recommend measures required to attain compliance with appropriate government regulations and the :orrection of hazardous conditions.
3) Consider recommendations from the workforce with respect to health and safety matters and recommend mplementation where warranted.
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4) Meet once a month for the review of reports of current accidents, occupational diseases and sprains and strains njuries, their causes and means of prevention; remedial action taken or required by the reports of investigations or inspections, and; any other matters pertaining to health and safety.
5) Record the minutes of the meetings that shall be reviewed by the co-chairs, distributed to the committee nembers, posted on the bulletin boards.
6) Committee members are entitled to one hour or such longer period of time as the committee determines is lecessary to prepare for each committee meeting, such time as is necessary to attend meetings of the committee ind such time as is necessary to carry out inspections and investigations under subsection 9 (26), 9 (27) and 9 31) of the "Act".
7) All scheduled hours of work otherwise spent by members of the committee in duties under this provision shall ee replaced by other employees consistent with this Agreement if in the Employer's opinion replacement is equired.
!4.03 (a) The Employer will ensure that all employees are aware of the requirement to practice universal recautions in all circumstances.
b) The Joint Health and Safety shall be provided with the annual summary of data from the Workplace Safety nsurance Board (WSIB) relating to the number of work accident fatalities, the number of lost workday cases, the lumber of lost workdays, the number of non-fatal cases that required medical aid with lost workdays, and the ncidence of occupational injuries.
!4.04 Every reported injury or accident will be investigated.
:4.05 The Employer agrees to give Union health and safety staff or Union health and safety consultants access to he workplace for the purposes of attending meetings of the health and safety committee or committee business e.g., inspecting, investigating) provided prior notice of at least ten (10) calendar days and approved by the :mployer. This request will not be unreasonably withheld.
!4.06 An employee who is injured during working hours and who is required to leave for treatment or is sent hom $\epsilon$ is a result of such injury shall receive payment for the rest of the shift at his/her regular rate of pay. Such mployee shall be provided with transportation to a doctor's office or hospital and/or to his/her home when unfit tc Irive. An employee who is absent from work as a result of an illness/injury sustained at work and who has been iwaiting approval of a claim of WSIB for a period greater that 5 working days may apply to the Employer for sayment equivalent to the lesser of the benefit they would be entitled to under WSIB or the short term sick portion If the HOODIP. In order for an employee to receive payment under this clause they will enter into a signed igreement with the Employer through the Occupational Health and Safety Services. Any monies forwarded to the ?mployee by the Employer will be repaid to the Employer, once the employee is in receipt of monies from WSIB.
!4.07 The Employer agrees that the joint health and safety committee will have the right to investigate complaints elated to indoor air quality/molds/ventilation.
:4.08 If incidents involving aggressive patient/resident action occur, such action will be recorded and reviewed at he Occupational Health and Safety Committee. The Employer will promptly take action to address the legitimate iealth and safety concerns of employees presented. The Employer recognizes that on occasion aggressive action o ratients/residents may cause damage to personal items of employees, such as eyeglasses. Incidents of aggressive satient/resident action that result in damage to the personal property will be immediately brought to the attention of the Director/designate. The Director/designate will review the situation and determine if any reimbursement for lamages to personal property is required.
!4.09 Where possible, each year on April 28 at 11:00 a.m., the Employer will observe the memory of workers illed or injured on the job with one (1) minute of silence.
!4.10 The Employer agrees to have the Union select an employee to attend education on ergonomic assessment.
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-he Employer will cover wages, to maintain the employee whole, up to thirty-seven and one half (37.5) hours. The Jnion will provide the request of time to attend, to the Employer, two (2) weeks in advance and include the date, ime and location of the education. The Employer will cover the costs of lost wages once in the life of this Collective tgreement.

## IRTI CLE 25 EDUCATI ON LEAVE

!5.01 (a) Where employees are required by the Employer to take courses or upgrade or acquire new employment qualifications, the Employer shall pay the full costs associated with the courses.
b) If required by the Employer, an employee shall be entitled to leave of absence with pay and without loss of ;eniority and benefits to write examinations to upgrade their employment qualifications.
c) Both the Employer and the Union recognize their joint responsibility and commitment to provide and participat $\epsilon$ n , in-service education. The union supports the principle of its' members' responsibility for their own professional levelopment and the Employer will provide programs related to the requirements of the Employer. Available رrograms will be publicized.
!5.02 When an employee is on duty and authorized by the Employer to attend any required in-service program vithin the Employer during their regular scheduled working hours, they shall suffer no loss of pay and such time vill be paid at the employee's applicable hourly rate.
!5.03 Where an employee is required to attend mandatory in-service programs as outlined in Article 25.02 and is inable to attend as a result of the in-service not being offered during the employee's regular scheduled working lours, they shall be paid at their regular straight hourly rate for all hours spent in the in-service.
!5.04 In conjunction with the Union committee the Employer will facilitate the arrangement of on-site CPR re:ertification sessions for employees.

## tRTICLE 26 PERSONAL LEAVE

!6.01 The Employer may grant a leave of absence without pay for personal reasons provided the employee can be ;pared having due regard for the proper operation of the Employer. Application of such leave shall be made in vriting to the Employer as far in advance as possible, but in any event at least one (1) week prior to the :ommencement of the leave, unless such notice in advance is impossible to give. The application must clearly stat he reason for the leave of absence and the duration of such absence. An employee will be credited with seniority luring an unpaid leave of absence up to a maximum of sixty (60) days.
!6.02 Allow employees to receive one (1) personal day unpaid per month, not to be construed as sick or absence 'ersonal days are to be selected by the employee and Employer by mutual agreement. It is understood that this :lause will not be additional to any clause under the Employment Standards Act or combined with any clause under he Employment Standards Act to provide for more than one personal day unpaid per month.

## tRTICLE 27 BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

17.01 An employee who notifies the Employer as soon as possible following a bereavement shall be granted up to ive (5) working days off, within seven (7) calendar days, in conjunction with the day of death, without loss of their egular earnings for their scheduled hours for a member of their immediate family. "Immediate family" means ipouse, common-law spouse, partner of the same sex, child or stepchild and parents. Up to three (3) working days ,ff, within seven (7) calendar days, in conjunction with the day of death, without loss of regular earnings for their icheduled hours for other members of their family including step-parents, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother, ;ister, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, grandparents, spouse's grandparent, grandchild, son-in-law and daughter-inaw. The relationships set above are deemed to include those family relationships arising from relationship with a :ommon-law and/or partner of the same sex.
!7.02 The employer, upon request, may extend such leave with or without pay where an employee does not
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jualify under the above-noted definition.
17.03 All employees will receive credit for service and seniority during such leaves as outlined in Article 27.01 above.

## :7.04 Part Time Only

Ill days that otherwise would qualify as per Article 27.01 as paid bereavement leave shall be considered as a day vorked if the employee had the opportunity to work based on the practice of equalization within the scheduling init.

## \RTICLE 28 PREGNANCY PARENTAL LEAVE

'regnancy Leave (Applicable to Full-Time and Part-Time employees)
18.01 Pregnancy leave will be granted in accordance with the provisions of the Employment Standards Act, except vhere amended in this provision. The service requirement for eligibility for pregnancy leave shall be thirteen (13) veeks of continuous service. The employer agrees to provide a pregnancy leave of up to seventeen weeks (17) for i pregnant employee.
!8.02 It is agreed that the union and the bargaining unit employees shall not be disadvantaged in any way by any imendments to the Ontario Employment Standards Act and Regulations. For greater clarity, the Collective tgreement provisions shall prevail. Where this collective agreement provides an employee(s) with a greater right, enefit, term or condition for pregnancy leave, that specific right(s), benefit(s), term(s) or condition(s) in question n the Agreement shall prevail.
!8.03 In the event the Ontario Employment Standards Act and Regulations are amended to provide a greater ight, benefit, term or condition to an employee(s) with respect to pregnancy and parental leave than that which existed on March 31, 2000, each of such amended provisions shall be incorporated within this Collective tgreement.
!8.04 The employee shall give written notification at least two (2) weeks in advance of the date of commencement If such leave and the expected date of return. At such time she shall also furnish the Employer with the certificate If a legally qualified medical practitioner stating the expected birth date.
!8.05 The employee shall reconfirm her intention to return to work on the date originally approved in Article 28.04 ibove by written notification received by the Employer at least two (2) weeks in advance thereof.
18.06 An employee who is on pregnancy leave as provided under this Agreement who has applied for and is in eceipt of Employment Insurance pregnancy benefits pursuant to Section 18 of the Employment Insurance Act, ihall be paid a supplemental unemployment benefit. That benefit will be equivalent to the difference between :ighty-four percent ( $84 \%$ ) of her regular weekly earnings and the sum of her weekly Employment Insurance senefits. Such payment shall commence following completion of the two-week Employment Insurance waiting jeriod, and receipt by the Employer of the employee's Employment Insurance cheque stub as proof that she is in eceipt of Employment Insurance pregnancy benefits, and shall continue while the employee is in receipt of such senefits for a maximum period of fifteen (15) weeks. The employee's regular weekly earnings shall be determined ,y multiplying her regular hourly rate on her last day worked prior to the commencement of the leave times her lormal weekly hours. The normal weekly hours for a part time employee shall be calculated by using the same ime period as used for the calculation of the Employment Insurance benefit.

The Employer will pay the employee eighty-four percent ( $84 \%$ ) of her normal weekly earnings during the first two 2) week period of the leave while waiting to receive Employment Insurance Benefits.
3.07 The employee does not have any vested right except to receive payments for the covered unemployment jeriod. The plan provides that payment in respect of guaranteed annual remuneration or severance pay benefits ire not reduced or increased by payment received under the plan.
:8.08 Credits for service and seniority shall accumulate for a period of up to seventeen (17) weeks while an mployee is on pregnancy leave. For part-time employees such accumulation shall be on the basis of what the mployee's normal regular hours of work as calculated in Article 28.06 above.
!8.09 The employer will continue to pay its share of the premium contributions of subsidized employee benefits, ncluding the pension plan in which the employee is participating, for a period of up to seventeen (17) weeks while he employee is on pregnancy leave, should the employee choose to maintain benefits and make arrangements ;uitable with the Employer to contribute to the Employer their share of the premiums. Where applicable, the mployer will continue to pay a percentage in lieu of benefits and will register these benefits as part of the ;upplemental Unemployment Insurance Benefit Plan with the Unemployment Insurance Commission.
3.10 The employee shall be reinstated upon their return from pregnancy leave to her former position, shift and lepartment if it still exists or to a comparable position if it does not and receive the same rate of pay as the employee received prior to commencement of the leave.
!8.11 Pregnant employees may request to be transferred from their current duties if, in the professional opinion of he employee's physician and upon consultation with the Occupational Health Unit the pregnancy is at risk.
'arental Leave (Applicable to Full-Time and Part-Time employees)
?8.12 Parental leave will be granted in accordance with the provisions of the Employment Standards Act, except vhere amended in this provision. The service requirements for eligibility for parental leave shall be thirteen (13) veeks of continuous service.
!8.13 The employer agrees to provide a parental leave of up to 35 weeks for an employee who is a parent, ncluding an adoptive parent, following the birth of a child or the adoption of a child.
!8.14 It is agreed that the union and the bargaining unit employees shall not be disadvantaged in any way by any imendments to the Ontario Employment Standards Act and Regulations. For greater clarity, the Collective tgreement provisions shall prevail. Where this collective agreement provides an employee(s) with a greater right, enefit, term or condition for parental leave that specific right(s), benefit(s), term(s) or condition(s) in question in he Agreement shall prevail.
!8.15 In the event the Ontario Employment Standards Act and Regulations are amended to provide a greater ight, benefit, term or condition to an employee(s) with respect to pregnancy and parental leave than that which sxisted on March 31, 2000, each of such amended provisions shall be incorporated within this Collective tgreement.
18.16 An employee, who qualifies for parental leave, other than an adoptive parent, shall give written notification it least two (2) weeks in advance of the date of commencement of such leave and the expected date of return.
18.17 An employee who is an adoptive parent shall advise the employer as far in advance as possible of having jualified to adopt a child, and shall request the leave of absence, in writing, upon receipt of confirmation of the ,ending adoption. If, because of late receipt of confirmation of pending adoption, the employee finds it impossible o request the leave of absence in writing, the request may be made verbally, and subsequently verified in writing.
18.18 An employee who is an adoptive parent may extend the parental leave for such greater time as may be equired by the adoption agency concerned. Written notice by the employee for such extension will be given at east two (2) weeks prior to the termination of the initially approved leave.
18.19 An employee shall reconfirm his or her intention to return to work on the date originally approved in Article !8.16 above by written notification received by the Employer at least two (2) weeks in advance thereof.
18.20 An employee who is on parental leave as provided under this Agreement who has applied for and is in eceipt of Employment Insurance parental benefits pursuant to Section 18 of the Employment Insurance Act, shall ee paid a supplemental unemployment benefit. That benefit will be equivalent to the difference between eighty-

!8.22 Credits for service and seniority shall accumulate for a period of up to thirty-seven (37) weeks while an mployee is on parental leave, including an adoptive parent on parental leave as calculated in Article 28.20 above.
18.23 The Employer will continue to pay its share of the premiums of the subsidized employee benefits, including eension, in which the employee is participating, for a period of up to thirty-seven (37) weeks while the employee is ın parental leave, including an adoptive parent on parental leave, should the employee choose to maintain נenefits and make arrangements suitable with the Employer to contribute to the Employer their share of the رremiums. Where applicable, the Employer will also continue to pay the percentage in lieu of benefits for a period If up to thirty seven (37) weeks and will register these benefits as part of the Supplemental Unemployment nsurance Benefit Plan with the Canada Employment Insurance Commission.
!8.24 The employee shall be reinstated upon their return to from parental leave to her former position, shift and lepartment if it still exists or to a comparable position if it does not and receive the same rate of pay as the smployee received prior to commencement of the leave.

## IRTICLE 29 UNI ON LEAVE

19.01 Leave of absence for Union business shall be given at each site (Mount Hope Centre for Long Term Care, 'arkwood Hospital, St. Joseph's Hospital) without pay up to a maximum for all employees of 60 days per calendar 'ear provided such leave does not interfere with the continuance of efficient operation of the Employer.
;uch leave shall be subject to the following conditions:
a) not more than six (6) employees of the Employer at each site (Mount Hope Centre for Long Term Care, 'arkwood Hospital, St. Joseph's Hospital) are absent on any such leave at the same time, and not more than two 2) employees from a department;
b) a request must be made in writing at least two (2) weeks prior to the commencement of the function for which eave is requested;
c) such request shall state the general nature of the function to be attended;
d) employees on a Union Leave which is approved by the Employer in accordance with the above conditions shall ,e paid for such leave by the Employer. The Employer shall then forward a statement to the Union for the full costs )f wages and benefits associated with the leave plus $10 \%$ of wages for reimbursement of the amount stated.

## IRTI CLE 30 J URY AND WITNESS DUTY

30.01 If an employee is required to serve in any court of law, or is required by court subpoena to attend court )roceedings by the Crown, or College of Nurses' hearing, or is required by subpoena to attend a case arising from he employee's duties at the Employer, the employee shall not lose regular pay because of necessary absence fron vork due to such attendance, and shall not be required to work on the day of such duty, provided that the mployee:
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a) notifies the Employer immediately on an employee's notification that he will be required to attend court;
b) presents proof of service requiring the employee's attendance;
c) deposits with the Employer the full amount of compensation received excluding mileage, travelling and meal illowances and an official receipt thereof.

## tRTI CLE 31 EFFECT OF ABSENCE

31.01 In the event of an employee's absence without pay from the Employer exceeds the employees length of iervice or a minimum of sixty (60) days, the employee will not accumulate service for any purposes under the :ollective agreement for the duration of such absence. The benefits concerned shall be appropriately reduced on a رro rata basis and the employee's anniversary date adjusted accordingly. During such absence the employee will ee responsible for full payment of all subsidized employee benefits in which the employee is participating. The employee may arrange with the Employer to pre-pay to the Employer the full premium of such subsidized mployee benefits for the entire period of the leave to ensure the employee's continued coverage.
31.02 Where an employee is on sick leave or receiving WSIB benefits or has qualified for WSIB benefits and is iwaiting payment, or Long Term Disability seniority for all purposes shall continue.

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34.01 (a) The normal workweek shall be composed of an average of thirty-seven and one-half ( $371 / 2$ ) hours per veek over the period scheduled by the Employer. The normal workday shall be seven and one-half ( $71 / 2$ ) hours sxclusive of an unpaid meal period within eight (8) consecutive hours.
b) The normal daily paid hours of work for Attendants employed at the Withdrawal Management Services and the Vithdrawal Management Workers at the Withdrawal management Services and the Engineers, will comprise eight 8) consecutive hours inclusive of two (2) fifteen minute rest periods and one paid thirty (30) minute meal period. -he normal weekly paid hours of work shall consist of forty (40) hours per week over the period scheduled by the :mployer.
34.02 (a) Two (2) paid rest periods of fifteen (15) consecutive minutes and an unpaid meal period of thirty (30) ninutes shall be provided during each workday;
b) Employees working a shift less than eight (8) consecutive hours in duration, will be allowed a rest period of ifteen (15) consecutive minutes without any loss of pay within every three and three-quarter ( $33 / 4$ ) hours of work.
c) Upon mutual agreement between the Employer and the employee, daily rest periods may be taken together.
34.03 (a) All authorized time worked beyond the normal hours will be considered overtime and paid at one and lalf ( $1^{1 / 2}$ ) times the straight hourly rate of the employee. There will be no pyramiding of overtime; once time vorked is used for an overtime calculation it shall not be used on any other basis for calculating overtime.
b) Employees required to perform such overtime work shall not be required to take time off during a normal vorking period in lieu of overtime work performed. Time off in lieu of overtime shall be by mutual agreement.

34.07 Employees will not be required to work more than six (6) consecutive shifts when working eight (8) hour ;hifts unless otherwise agreed upon by the employee and the Employer. Any employee who works six (6)
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:onsecutive days will be scheduled two (2) consecutive days off work. A period of no less than two (2) consecutive ;hifts off shall be scheduled between a change of shift and at least six (6) consecutive shifts shall be scheduled ollowing scheduled night shifts.
34.08 Where the Employer provides less than twenty-four (24) hours notice of a shift change, the affected employees will be paid time and one half ( $11 / 2$ ) of the employee's regular straight time hourly rate for all hours vorked on the next scheduled shift.

34.09 Extended hours will be introduced in any unit when:

1) Any employee who wishes to enter into an extended hour shift will do so with the knowledge and agreement of he employee, the Employer and the Union.

)) The Union and the Employer agree to a process to implement extended hours in a unit/department.
34.10 Employees working extended hours shall not receive a greater or lesser benefit than employees working ;even and one-half (72) hour shifts.
34.11 The impact of extended hours as outlined in this Agreement shall take precedence over similar articles in the :ollective agreement between the parties.
34.12 The probationary period referred to in this Collective Agreement shall be those expressed in hours.
34.13 The extended hour shift will consist of either 9.375 hours or 11.25 hours a shift or 150 hours in two (2) jiweekly pay periods. Authorized work performed in excess of these hours will be paid at time and one-half the mployee's regular straight time hourly rate. 34.15 Vacation leave will be in accordance with Article 33 of this Collective Agreement, but modified to an hourly srorated equivalent.
34.16 Paid holidays for employees working extended hours will be granted in accordance with the Collective tgreement but payment will be modified to an hourly prorated equivalent. Lieu days will be calculated in the same nanner.
34.17 Shift premium will be paid in accordance with Article 37 of this Collective Agreement.
34.18 Employees working extended hours who are returning to work after absence due to illness or leave of absence shall, wherever possible, give 16 hours notice of his/her intention of returning to duty. 34.19 Bereavement leave will be granted in accordance with the collective agreement. Payment for bereavement
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eave will be calculated for all hours of the employees working extended shifts.
34.20 Employees working extended hours will be paid sick leave as provided for under HOODIP pursuant to the ollective agreement but modified to an hourly-prorated equivalent.
'art Time Only
t part time employee is an employee who is normally pre-scheduled less than thirty-seven and one half ( $371 / 2$ ) lours per week. In addition, part time employees are scheduled on a relief basis to fill in for illness, vacation and ther staff shortages as determined by the Employer.
34.21 Scheduling shall be determined by the Employer to maintain adequate and capable employees in order to رrovide proper care subject to the provisions of this Agreement. Where applicable part time employees will :ontinue the practice of providing the Employer with their availability prior to the scheduling of any six (6) week icheduling period.
34.22 Prior to posting of the six (6) week period at least two (2) weeks in advance, hours will be distributed ?quitably between all Part Time employees within a unit/department averaged over the posted schedule. Overtime vill be paid on all hours worked in excess of seventy-five (75) hours in a bi-weekly pay period for tours of 7.5 lours. Over time will be paid on all hours worked in excess of one hundred fifty (150) hours in two (2) bi-weekly lay periods for extended tours of 11.25 hours or 9.375 hours. If part time employees work both 7.5 hour tours and 11.25 hour tours they will be considered for overtime over two (2) bi-weekly pay periods.
34.23 All Part Time employees will be given the same consideration as full time employees for break/rest/meal seriods as outlined above in Article 34.
34.24 Effective on or before October 31, 2003. Definitions of Shift.
3.75 hours to 6 hours equals 0.5 shift Greater than 6 hours to 9 hours equals 1.0 shifts Greater than 9.0 to 12.0 ours equals 1.5 shifts
'art time employees who are interested in being available to work additional shifts within their scheduling unit will lotify their Director or their designate in writing of their availability two (2) weeks prior to the posted schedule. 'art time employees who are interested in being available to work outside their scheduling unit, within their :lassification and who hold the bona fide qualifications and ability to perform the work as assessed by the Director or their designate will do so in writing. The Employer will offer on an equitable basis any additional shifts to the , art time employees within the scheduling unit where the shift needs to be filled. Should no part time employee be ivailable to work, the Employer will offer the shifts to those part time employees who have made themselves ivailable to the scheduling unit.
'art time employees who wish to make themselves available to work outside their current classification and who old the bona fide qualifications and ability to perform the work as assessed by the Director or their designate will lo so in writing. Employees will have the ability to hold only one such alternate classification. The Employer will ,ffer shifts to such employees only when there are no other available part time employees within the classification. juch employees will make their availability known in writing to the Director or designate two (2) weeks prior to the losted scheduled. The Employer reserves the right to determine the number of alternate positions and the :ontinued ability of any such employee in an alternate position. 34.25

1) A shift will be deemed offered, when a call is placed to an employee. If an employee accepts or declines the ,ffer, the offer will be recorded as a shift worked. If an employee notifies their Employer they are not available here is no obligation on the Employer to try to contact the employee. It is expected that an employee will work all icheduled shifts. An employee who accepts an offered shift from the Employer will work the shift offered by the :mployer, unless arrangements satisfactory to the Employer are made.
)) Part time employees who schedule vacation on pre-scheduled days will have the prescheduled days count as an ,pportunity to work. Should there be other available work, on the dates the part time employee is scheduled on
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'acation that would have otherwise been offered to the part time employee, this will also count as an opportunity.
!4.26 A minimum of three and three-quarters ( $33 / 4$ ) scheduled hours of work will be provided for or three and hree-quarters ( $33 / 4$ ) hours will be paid except for Registered Practical Nurses (RPN) at Parkwood Hospital who shall lave a minimum of four (4) scheduled hours of work provided for or four (4) hours will be paid.
tll Full Time, Part Time
34.27 All employees will be available to work either the Christmas and Boxing Day period or the New Years period. he Christmas Boxing Day period is defined as December 24th 0700 hours to December 27th 0700 hours. The Nen 'ears period is defined as December 31st at 0700 until January 2nd 0700 hours.
34.28 Requests by employees for employees for changes in schedule must be submitted in writing and co-signed ,y an employee willing to exchange and approved by the Director or designate. It is understood that such changes vill not result in overtime payments.
34.29 When a Registered Practical Nurse (RPN) is on duty and has the authorization to attend any in-service rogram within the Hospital and their regularly scheduled working hours they shall suffer no loss of regular pay. Vhen a RPN is required by the Employer to attend courses outside their regularly scheduled working hours the mployee shall be paid for all time spent in attendance on such courses at the employee's regular straight time lourly rate of pay.
34.30 Either party may request a meeting for the purpose of discussing amendments to the scheduling procedure n effect. Such amendments to the scheduling procedure shall not be implemented until such meeting has been leld.

### 34.31 Reporting Pay

a) Employees who report for any scheduled shift will be guaranteed at least four (4) hours of work, or if no work $s$ available will be paid at least four (4) hours unless work is not available due to conditions beyond the control of he Employer. The reporting allowance as outlined herein shall not apply whenever an employee has received prior otice not to report to work.
b) An employee called in to work shall be paid for the full shift provided the employee is at their work station vithin one (1) hour of being called and provided that the employee was contacted within one (1) hour of the eeginning of the shift.

## IRTICLE 35 J OB SHARE

35.01 Job Sharing, for the purpose of this Agreement, shall be defined as the sharing of the hours and the esponsibilities of a seven (7) day work week by two (2) existing employees in the same classification: one (1) full. ime employee and one (1) part-time employee.
35.02 Once a full-time employee has indicated their desire to Job Share, the part-time component of that irrangement shall be determined subsequent to a posting as per the Collective Agreement.
35.03 Job Sharers shall be considered part-time employees and shall be subject to the applicable provisions of the jollective Agreement, unless otherwise amended by this Article.
35.04 It is agreed and understood that no more than one-third (1/3) of the full time positions on each init/department shall be open to a potential job-sharing arrangement.
35.05 Both employees will prepare and agree upon a time schedule with an equitable distribution of hours. They vill submit their schedule to the Director or designate for approval and posting.
35.06 Each Job Sharer shall be responsible for normal coverage of their partner's vacation up to full-time hours.
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35.07 The Job sharers involved will have the right to determine between themselves which partner will work on icheduled paid holidays subject to the conditions of the Collective Agreement. If an agreement cannot be reached, he division of paid holidays shall be equalized.
35.08 In the event of incidental absence or illness, part-time employees will be offered the shift in accordance with he Collective Agreement. If no part-time employee is available to work, the job-share parties will be expected, on I reasonable basis, to cover the sick time up to full-time hours.

### 35.09

a) In the event the former full-time employee leaves the partnership, the position shall be posted as a full-time oosition and the part-time employee reverts to a part-time position.
b) In the event the part-time employee leaves the partnership, the former full-time partner has the option of everting to full-time or remaining as a Job Sharer. If they choose job sharing, the part-time component of the job. ;hare position shall be posted as per the Collective Agreement.
35.10 It is understood and agreed that a full-time employee who enters into a Job-Sharing agreement may opt out )f such agreement and revert to his/her full-time position with written notice of eight (8) weeks to the Director or lesignate. Such Job Sharer's partner shall, consequently, revert to a part-time position.
35.11 The agreement to job share will remain between both employees so long as they are compatible, and the leeds of the unit/department are met. If either of these two criteria are not met, there will be consultation jetween the Job Sharers, Director or designate and Union to attempt to resolve the issue or dissolve the sartnership.
35.12 In the event of a layoff it is agreed that Job Sharers from the full-time will be listed on the full-time seniority ist and likewise the part-time on the part-time seniority list.

## ARTICLE 36 PREMI UM PAYMENTS

36.01 Shift Premium
:mployees shall be paid a shift premium of fifty-five cents ( $\$ 0.55$ ) per hour for each hour worked on an afternoon )r night shift where fifty percent ( $50 \%$ ) of hours worked fall between 1500 hours one day and 0700 hour the ollowing day. Commencing April 1, 2004 the premium will be adjusted to sixty cents ( $\$ 0.60$ ) and further adjusted tpril 1, 2005 to sixty-eight cents ( $\$ 0.68$ ).
36.02 Weekend Premium

Members of the bargaining unit shall be paid a weekend premium of sixty-five cents (\$0.65) per hour for each houi vorked between 2300 hours Friday and 2300 hours Sunday, or such other forty eight (48) hour period as the local jarties may agree upon. Commencing April 1, 2004 the premium will be adjusted to seventy cents ( $\$ 0.70$ ) and urther adjusted April 1, 2005 to seventy-eight cents (\$0.78).

### 36.03 Higher Paying Positions Within the Bargaining Unit

Where an employee is assigned temporarily to perform the duties and assume the responsibilities of a higher Jaying position in the bargaining unit they shall be paid the rate of the higher paying position corresponding to heir placement on the wage grid relative to their current rate from the commencement of the shift on which they vere assigned the job.
36.04 Lower Paying Position Within the Bargaining Unit

Where an employee is assigned temporarily by the Employer to perform the duties and assume the responsibilities If a lower paying position within the bargaining unit, they shall continue to be paid their current rate of pay
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:orresponding to the position held immediately prior to such assignment from the commencement of the issignment and for the duration of such assignment.
36.05 Premium Payment on Shift Cancellation

Vhen the employer fails to provide a full time employee a cancellation notice no less than twenty four (24) hours )rior to the commencement of the shift or a part time employee twelve (12) hours prior to the commencement of he shift, a premium payment equal to one and a half ( $1^{1 / 2}$ ) times the employees regular rate of pay will be paid on heir next scheduled shift.
36.06 Standby Pay (Full-time and Part-time employees)

In employee who is required to remain available for duty on standby outside their regularly scheduled working lours shall receive standby pay in the amount of $\$ 2.50$ per hour for the period of standby scheduled by the Employer.

Vhere such standby duty falls on a paid holiday, the employee shall receive standby pay in the amount of $\$ 2.75$ eer hour

### 36.07 Call Back Pay

a) Where employees are called back to work after having completed a regular shift and prior to the :ommencement of their next regular shift, they shall receive a minimum of four (4) hours pay at the rate of time ind one-half ( $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ) their regular hourly rate. Where call back is immediately prior to the commencement of a egular shift they shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half ( $11 / 2$ ) their regular hourly rate for up to four (4) ours prior to the commencement of the shift, at which time they shall revert back to the regular shift and regular itraight hourly rate.
b) Call back pay shall cover all calls within the minimum of four (4) hour period provided for under (a) above. If a ;econd call takes place after the four (4) hours have elapsed from the time of the first call, it shall be subject to a ;econd call back premium, but in no case shall an employee collect two (2) call back premiums within one such our (4) hour period and to the extent that a call back overlaps and extends into the hours of his regular shift, (a) ibove shall apply.
c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, an employee who has worked their full shift on a holiday and is called back shal eceive the greater of two and one-half ( $21 / 2$ ) times their regular straight hourly rate for all hours actually worked on such call back or four (4) hours pay at time and one-half ( $11 / 2$ ) times their straight hourly rate subject to the ther provisions set out above.
d) Full Time Only
n lieu of call back pay, an employee may take equivalent time off with pay at a mutually agreeable time within ;ixty (60) days following the call back or such longer period as may be agreed upon. Where no agreement is eached, the employee shall be paid in accordance with Article 36.07.

## tRTI CLE 37 NEW CLASSI FICATI ON

37.01 When a new classification which is covered by the terms of this Collective Agreement is established by the :mployer, the Employer shall determine the rate of pay for such new classification and notify the local Union of the iame. If the local Union challenges the rate, it shall have the right to request a meeting with the Employer to ?ndeavour to negotiate a mutually satisfactory rate. Such request will be made within ten (10) days after the eceipt of notice from the Employer of such new classification and rate. Any change mutually agreed to resulting rom such meeting shall be retroactive to the date that notice of the new rate was given by the Employer. If the parties are unable to agree, the dispute concerning the new rate may be submitted to arbitration as provided in he Agreement within fifteen (15) days of such meeting. The decision of the Board of Arbitration shall be based on he relationship established by comparison with the rates for other classifications in the bargaining unit, having
egard to the requirements of such classification, and shall be retroactive to the date that notice of the new rate vas given by the Employer.

## tRTICLE 38 HEALTH \& WELFARE

:ull-Time Only
38.01 (a) The Employer agrees to contribute on behalf of each eligible active employee in the employ of the :mployer seventy-five percent ( $75 \%$ ) of the billed premium for a 10/20 deductible extended health plan subject to he terms and conditions of such a plan. Effective the first billing date following the ratification of this Collective tgreement, such coverage will include glasses at a maximum of one hundred fifty dollars ( $\$ 150.00$ ) every twentyour (24) months and hearing aids to a maximum of five hundred ( $\$ 500.00$ ) dollars every five (5) years per ndividual. Coverage will include an acute care private room and private duty nursing as outlined in the plan. The :overage of the dental plan will be equivalent to Blue Cross \#9, current ODA schedule plus the coverage of denturt ebasing and relining and resetting of teeth and co-insurance at one thousand dollar ( $\$ 1,000.00$ ) maximum ifetime for orthodontics and $50 / 50$ co-insurance at one thousand dollars ( $\$ 1,000.00$ ) maximum per calendar year or each of crowns and dentures. The dental recall will be every nine (9) months for adults only. The extended lealth care plan will cover only prescription drugs that cannot be purchased over the counter (formulary 3 drugs are not covered) and such plan will include a drug card.
:or the purposes of extended health and dental benefits, dependent means a person recognized by either the :amily Law Act, Human rights Code, Income Tax Act or the Pension Act.
b) The Employer agrees to pay one hundred percent (100\%) of the billed premium for coverage of eligible :mployees for Semi-Private Insurance for each active employee in the Employ of the Employer eligible for :overage.
c) The Employer agrees to pay one hundred percent (100\%) of the billed premium for the coverage of eligible mployees under the Hospitals of Ontario Group Life Insurance Plan (HOOGLIP) for each active employee in the mploy of the Employer.
38.02 The liability of the Employer shall be limited to deducting the employees' contributions referred to herein anc orwarding these and the Employer's contributions to the insurer. The administration of the various plans shall be he responsibility of the insurer, provided however that an employee has the right to grieve in respect of these Jlans, but such grievances shall be limited to matters that fall within the direct control of the Employer.
38.03 The Employer will continue to pay its' share of the above insured benefit premiums for employees who are ir eceipt of short-term disability from the Employer.
38.04 Employees shall enroll in the hospitals of Ontario Pension Plan (HOOPP) in accordance with the provisions ind requirements of the Plan.
38.05 It is understood that the Employer may at any time substitute another carrier for any Plan (other than OHIP: )rovided the benefits conferred thereby are not in total decreased. Before making such a substitution, the :mployer shall notify the Union to explain the proposed change and to ascertain the views of the employees.

Jpon request by the Union, the Employer shall provide to the Union full specifications of the benefit programs :ontracted for and in effect for employees covered herein.
'art-Time Only
38.06 A part-time employee shall receive payment in lieu of health and welfare benefits as outlined in this Article lmounting to fourteen percent ( $14 \%$ ) of their straight time hourly rate effective April 1, 2001. This payment will 1ot be included in any calculation of overtime and vacation.
:ull-Time and Part-Time
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38.07 The Employer agrees to pay one hundred percent (100\%) of the premium cost for the Employer Health Tax or equivalent.

## \RTICLE 39 SICK LEAVE/ LONG TERM DI SABI LITY

:ull-Time Only

39.01 The Employer will pay a seventy-five percent (75\%) of the billed premium toward coverage of eligible mployees under the long-term disability portion of the plan (HOODIP or an equivalent plan), the employee paying he balance of the billed premium through payroll deduction. Following three (3) months of service with the Employer, employees will qualify for the short-term portion of the disability program. Following one (1) year of iervice with the Employer, employees will qualify for the long-term portion of the disability program. An employee nust return for three (3) weeks full employment, not including work re-entry time period, to re-initiate the first 15 veeks of disability.
39.02 Effective the first of the month following the transfer all existing sick leave plans in the affected Employers ;hall be terminated and any provisions relating to such plans shall be null and void under the respective collective igreements except as to those provisions relating to payout of unused sick leave benefits which are specifically lealt with hereinafter.
:xisting sick leave credits for each employee shall be converted to a sick leave bank to the credit of the employee it the then current per diem rate of pay based on his regular straight time hourly rate. The "sick leave bank" shall ee utilized to:

1) supplement payment for lost straight time wages on sick leave days under the new program which would ,therwise be at less than full wages or no wages; and
)) where, a pay-out provision existed under the former sick leave plan in the Collective Agreement, pay-out on ermination of employment shall be that portion of any unused sick leave dollars under the former conditions elating to pay-out;
:) where, as of the effective date of transfer, an employee does not have the required service to qualify for payut on termination, their existing sick leave credits as of the date shall nevertheless be converted to a sick leave rank in accordance with the foregoing and they shall be entitled, on termination, to that portion of any unused sick eave dollars providing he subsequently achieves the necessary service to qualify them for pay-out under the :onditions relating to such pay-out.
39.03 The liability of the Employer shall be limited to deducting the employees' contributions referred to herein anc orwarding these and the Employer's contributions to the insurer (Hospitals of Ontario Disability Insurance Plan). -he administration of the various plans shall be the responsibility of the insurer, provided however that an employee has the right to grieve in respect of these plans, but such grievances shall be limited to matters that fall vithin the direct control of the Employer.
39.04 Full-Time and Part-Time
:mployees will endeavour to schedule all medical, dental and specialist appointments outside working hours; lowever if an employee is referred to a specialist by a general practitioner and if the specialists appointment can lot be booked outside of working hours, the employee should discuss with their Director/designate any idjustments that can be made to accommodate the appointment in order to maintain the employee as whole. The mployee should review with their Director/designate as soon as possible after notification by the specialist the late and time of the appointment. The employee does not need to disclose details with respect to the nature of the appointment to their Director/designate. Part time employees who need to alter their schedule due to specialists' ippointments will maintain their equalization of opportunity to work.
39.05 Full-Time and Part-Time

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In employee who is required to have a medical examination and/or produce a doctor's certificate pursuant to this igreement, shall be reimbursed by the employer for such expense upon producing a proper receipt. An employee vho is required to have a medical examination and/or produce a doctor's certificate pursuant to provincial egulations, shall be reimbursed by the employer for such expense upon producing a proper receipt.

### 39.06 Part-Time Only

:or the purpose of transfer to the short- term portion of the disability program, following the successful posting to a ull-time position under this Collective Agreement, employees with four hundred and fifteen (415) hours of service vith the Employer as of the effective date of the transfer shall be deemed to have three (3) months of service inder Article 39.01. For the purpose of transfer to the long-term portion of the disability program, following the iuccessful posting to a full-time position under this Collective Agreement, employees with one thousand, six lundred, fifty (1650) hours of service with the Employer as of the effective date of the transfer shall be deemed to lave one (1) year of service under Article 39.01.
39.07 Full-Time Only
:mployees may claim for sick pay if Workplace Safety and Insurance eligibility is pending. The employee will eimburse the Employer the full amount of sick pay received upon receipt of WSIB payment.
39.08 Full-Time and Part-Time
-he employee will call the Director/designate to notify the Employer they are unable to attend work due to illness. tn employee who continues to be ill on the fourth (4th) and fifth (5th) day of an illness will report to the )ccupational Health Unit upon return to work. If an employee is ill for more than five (5) days they will require a 'hysicians certificate of illness to qualify for sick pay upon the request of the Employer.

Jotwithstanding the foregoing, the Employer may require the employee to provide proof of disability, satisfactory o the Employer, at any time in order to qualify for benefits under HOODIP, not to be administered unreasonably. $t$ is the responsibility of the employee to keep the Employer informed of their status and regular contact must be naintained.

## tRTI CLE 40 ALLOWANCES

### 10.01 Uniform Allowance

a) Full-Time Only The Employer will pay an annual allowance of eighty dollars ( $\$ 80.00$ ) per year for uniforms to ill employees in the bargaining unit that are required by the Employer to wear uniforms while on duty which the :mployer does not supply, payable on the first pay in April of each calendar year.
b) Part-Time Only The Employer will pay an annual allowance of $\$ 0.045$ per hour for uniforms to all employees in he bargaining unit that are required by the Employer to wear uniforms while on duty which the Employer does not ;upply.
10.02 Safety Shoe Allowance

The Employer will provide a safety shoe allowance of up to one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) once every two :alendar years, for safety shoes that do not require a green triangle to each employee who is required to wear iafety shoes and who provides the Employer with proof of purchase within the two-year limit. Such shoes must be :mployer and C.S.A. approved.

The Employer will provide a safety shoe allowance of up to one hundred seventy-five dollars ( $\$ 175.00$ ) once every wo calendar years, for safety shoes that require a green triangle to each employee who is required to wear safety ihoes and who provides the Employer with proof of purchase within the two-year limit. Such shoes must be :mployer and C.S.A. approved.
-he Employer will supply a list to the Union where safety shoes are required and the type required if special equirements are needed.

11.01 Skilled trades for the purpose of this agreement shall be the following:

The Employer has the right to determine qualifications required for skilled trades in the specific classifications.
11.02 A journeyperson in any of the designated Skilled Trades shall mean any person:
a) who presently holds a Certificate of Qualification in a skilled trade as defined above, or
b) who has served a bona fide apprenticeship and holds a certification which substantiates their claim of such iervice and holds a Certificate of Qualification, or
c) who has eight (8) years of practical experience in the skilled trade in which they claim Journeyman/woman's lesignation and can prove same, a CAW Journeyman/woman Card will be accepted as proof plus a Certificate of 2ualification.
11.03 Any further new employees hired into a classification that requires a skilled trades qualification after signing his Agreement, shall be limited to journeyman/woman.
11.04 The Employer agrees to deduct Canadian Skilled Trades Council dues as adopted by the Canadian Skilled rades Council, $1 / 2$ hour per year from those employees who are deemed by the Employer as a skilled trade as ecognized under Article 42.01. This first such deduction will be made from the employee's first pay following :ompletion of their probationary period. Thereafter deductions will be made in J anuary of each succeeding calendar 'ear. These deductions along with the names of the employees shall be remitted to the financial secretary of the Jnion.
11.05 If the Employer requires an apprenticeship program, they will meet with the Union and establish the igreement with the CAW and the Ministry.

## IRTI CLE 42 RETROACTI VITY

1201 The increases to the wage rates shall be effective to the dates listed on a retroactive basis to all employees ir he existing bargaining unit for all paid hours of employment. Any new employees hired shall be entitled to a proata adjustment to their remuneration from the start date of their employment. The Employer shall be responsible or contacting employees who have left the employ of the Employer in writing at their last know address to advise hem of their entitlement to any retroactive wage adjustment. Copy of such notices shall be provided to the Union Zhairperson. Such employees shall have a period of sixty (60) days only, from the date of posting by the Employer n which to claim any retroactive adjustment. Any employee who has terminated their employment prior to the
；igning of this Collective Agreement shall have a period of ninety（90）days from the date of ratification in which to ：laim from the Employer any adjustment to remuneration．

12．02 All retroactive payments shall be made in the form of individual，fully itemized cheques or deposits itatements within ninety（90）days of the date of ratification for all present employees．

12．03 If the Employer has not paid the retroactive payments to present employees within ninety（90）days of the late of ratification，interest shall be paid at the highest bank rate of interest on the total amount of the retroactive ，ayment．

## tRTI CLE 43 WAGES

13．01 The wage adjustments in schedule＂A＂resolve the Pay Equity maintenance to the date of the expiration of his Collective Agreement and the parties agree that future collective bargaining settlements or awards will be leemed to resolve any future issues related to Pay Equity maintenance to male comparators．It is understood and igreed that the parties will take into consideration the issue of Pay Equity when tabling proposals through the lormal course of collective bargaining．

May 1， 2003 and April 1，2004，active full time employees in the following classifications will receive a lump sum idjust of five hundred dollars（\＄500．00）and active part time employees will receive two hundred fifty（\＄250．00）；
